Smiths Medical CADD® Non Flow-Stop Medication Cassette Reservoirs – recall of specific lots due to risk of under delivery of medication

Summary

Smiths Medical CADD® Non Flow-Stop Medication Cassette Reservoirs may have been manufactured with an incorrect pressure plate which could cause partial or total occlusion of the tubing with no alarm.

Action

- Refer to the manufacturer's Field Safety Notice (FSN) for a list of affected product codes and the attached spreadsheet for a list of affected lots
- Identify, stop using and quarantine these devices
- Contact Stericycle to return the devices as directed in the manufacturer's FSN

Action by

All healthcare professionals who are responsible for, or who use these devices

Deadlines for actions

Actions underway: 04 July 2018 Actions complete: 18 July 2018

Medical Device Safety Officers (in England): ask the manufacturer to add you to their distribution list for field safety notices (FSNs). This is to help ensure FSNs are acted upon fully within your organisation and the manufacturer informed appropriately.

Remember: if your organisation receives an FSN from a manufacturer, always act on it. **Do not wait** for a communication from MHRA.







Device details

CADD® Medication Cassette Reservoirs are intended for ambulatory volumetric infusion of small doses (up to 50ml,100ml, or 250ml), and are designed to be used with a variety of CADD ambulatory infusion pumps (except CADD-Micro™, CADD-MS® 3 and CADD-TPN® pumps).
